Sickle Cell Disease Educational Seminar: the politics and culture of pain

This year's program features keynote speakers **Drs. 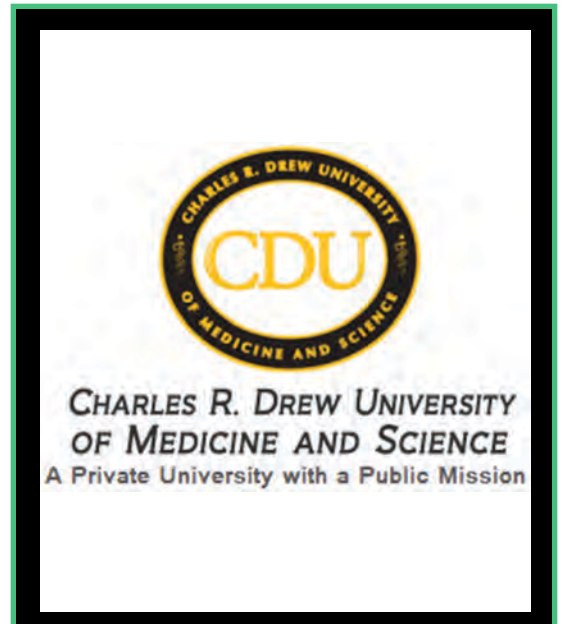
